Awareness Month

Nearly 1 in 3 American women report being physically or sexually abused by a husband or boyfriend at some point in their lives. In Maine, the crime of domestic violence as reported to police occurs every 96 minutes.

Domestic violence affects *people of all faiths and every faith community*.

Domestic violence flourishes in silence and isolation. Churches and congregations can help:

- ✚ display resource materials from the local domestic violence project in the church
- ✚ name the problem and proclaim that domestic violence is wrong during worship from the pulpit and in prayer;
- ✚ recognize October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month
- ✚ encourage values of gender equality and nonviolence when working with children and youth
- ✚ invite staff from the local domestic violence project to make an educational presentation or learn how you can help by calling the helpline
